Last term, KS2 all attended Mass at Saint Patrick's which is open to all. This will continue throughout the year.

The children are currently busy preparing for their Christmas Nativities and performances, which is the children's gift to their families, highlighting the important message of Christmas.

In the Spring Term, all classes will invite parents to watch their class assemblies, where they will celebrate their learning from the term. Unfortunately, although we would love to be able to invite parents in to more whole school celebrations such as Harvest and Epiphany, due to fire regulations we do have to limit numbers in the hall for everyone's safety.

Last year, we introduced 'Stay and Pray' for all of our parents- this was an opportunity for adults to pray together at the start of the day during Lent. This will continue this in 2025-2026.



Enrichment opportunities allow us to really extend the children's learning and ignite a passion in new areas. We are only 3 months into the school year and so far KS2 have been visited by an author, Year 1 and 2 have visited Bath, we have taken part in NSPCC Speak Out Stay Safe workshops for Years 2,5 and 6, we have celebrated Geography Awareness Week and focussed on Black History Month, we have reflected on Remembrance across the school, as well as taking part in Football, Rugby, Hockey and Playground Games Festivals! We endeavour to ensure that our children experience as enriched a curriculum as possible, so please keep reading our newsletters, to keep up to date with our exciting learning opportunities and extracurricular events.

Our Chaplaincy Team is one of the stand out successes of Saint Patrick's, which we are extremely proud of. All children are welcome and we currently have over 60 members!

We continue to offer after school sports clubs on a Tuesday and a Thursday run by PH Sports. There is also a Gardening Club each term (alternating between KS1/KS2), as well as a Martial Arts Club @ Corsham Football Club on a Tuesday. 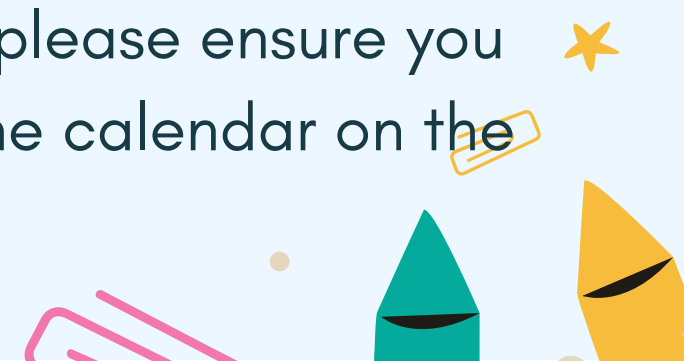
We thank you for continuing to work in partnership with us, to support your child. We love to hear about and celebrate everyone's achievements and experiences outside of school.

Recent Parent Evenings, have enabled your class teacher to ensure that you are aware of your child's successes and areas for development, so far this year. In the Spring Term, Years 1-6 receive an annual report about their child's progress and targets, then in the Summer Term there will be a final Parent's Evening, to discuss progress in these targets and a summary of the year. Reception children have their annual report at the end of the year, to celebrate their success in the Foundation Curriculum, and plan their next steps as they begin Year 1. However, we have an open-door policy, therefore if you need to discuss anything with your child's teacher, please do not hesitate to contact them via the School Office.
